#### **TARGET AUDIENCE**

This full-day conference is intended for those clinicians who participate in the care of neonates.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- Recognize key clinical factors for decision making for optimal care and outcomes.
- Identify a rare complex medical condition needing unique care, stabilization and transfer.
- Identify protocols and equipment needed to care for the extremely preterm infant.
- Recognize barriers that mothers of color may experience when approaching breastfeeding.
- Discuss respiratory management for premature infants, airway patients and severe bronchopulmonary dysplasia.
- Identify when Neurally Adjusted Ventilatory Assist (NAVA) could be a beneficial ventilatory mode.
- Discuss when and how to stop resuscitation of a neonate.
- List communication strategies with the family and the team after a failed resuscitation.
- Identify ways to minimize trauma responses and recognize parents' emotions and responses to provide the best care.
- Discuss the impact of the experience of trauma on parent's engagement with health care providers and the healthcare system.
- List three evidence-based resources that can guide clinicians when discussing safe medication use with breastfeeding mothers.

- Discuss optimizing staff support through the use of peer support teams.
- Identify the impact assignment-based orientation has on staff perception of preceptor burnout.
