


Visiting the Hospital at Children's Mercy Adele Hall

When you come to Children's Mercy, you will go to a check-in desk. They will ask who you are here to visit. Then, they will give you a visitor's sticker to wear.




Next, you will ride an elevator to the part of the hospital you are going to visit.

These help the nurses know how their body is doing.






You might also see an IV pole. An IV is a way to get medicine and water.
